The chapter practice tests pull random questions from a database, so you need to take these practice tests several times to get the full benefit. You should be able to score a 100 on any practice test at any time before you stop practicing. ☐ Complete **Assignments 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5.** Submit them prior to the due dates. Click **Assignments** on the Class Menu to access. The Assignment Submission Policy for CPT257 requires all assignments to be submitted within seven days of the published due date to receive any credit. Assignments must be submitted by the published due date to receive up to 100 percent credit. Within seven days after the due date, late assignments submitted late will receive a 20 point deduction for late submission. After the seven day grace period, no credit will be received for assignments submitted late.

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On-Campus Labs Explained

Summer 2012 Semester • August 13, 2012

Here is an explanation of the CPT257-W02 Online On-Campus Lab Rules:

- There are four mandatory On-Campus Labs in CPT257-Online. This semester our On-Campus Labs will be in Room 313 in the Engineering Building (103) on the Main Campus: CPT257-W02 will meet from 12:00 Noon to around 3:00 PM
- 2. During each **On-Campus Lab session**, you will be assigned **two lab exercises** to complete, see the schedule below. There are a total of **seven (7) lab exercises in CPT257**. The lab exercises build on each other, so if you miss a lab session/exercise, you will be behind in the whole lab experience. Since the Labs in **CPT257 account for 10% of your overall grade in CPT257**, this works out to **each Lab Exercise being worth about 1.25% of your overall grade**.
